

GUIDE FOR AUTHORS

Language

The submitted manuscripts can be written in Slovak, Czech and English language. Although contributions written in English are preferred, the editors do not provide any language translation or editing.

Digital requirements

The manuscript is required to be written without hyphenation, with the text aligned in a block and with the first line indented at 0.5 cm.

The manuscript template is available and its use is highly recommended.

- A4 size
- Margins 2.5 cm at the top, 2.5 cm at the bottom, 2.5 cm on the left, 1.5 cm on the right
- Single-spaced (1.0)
- Text font: 12pt, Times New Roman
- Sub-headings font: 12pt, Times New Roman, bold

Above the article title, two lines are omitted (one so-called bibliographic line of the journal and the second line as space).

Article title

It is required to be concise and informative. It should include information about the location or chronological classification of the study.

Font: Times New Roman, bold, 14pt, capital.

Author names

Please clearly indicate the given name(s) and family name(s) of each author. Indicate all authors from different affiliations with an upper case superscript letter immediately after the author's name.

Font: Times New Roman, bold, size 12pt.

Author affiliations

The authors' affiliation is required to be placed below the names in the following order: University (or another institution), Faculty, Department. Provide the full postal address of each affiliation, including street, city and state. E-mail address of the first or corresponding author is required.

Font: Times New Roman, basic, size 12 pt.

Article structure

Abstract

An abstract in English of a maximum of 200 words is required. The abstract should state briefly the purpose of the research, the principal results and major conclusions. The abstract of the article not written in English should include the article title in English, in italics font.

Keywords

Immediately after the abstract, provide 6 to 10 keywords and avoid using terms from the article title.

Acknowledgements

If funding has been provided, list the funding sources in the standard way to facilitate compliance to funder's requirements.

References

Citation style language style provided bellow.

Figures and tables

Figures should be in JPEG format, with correct resolution suitable for publishing (min. 300 DPI). Figure captions are listed immediately below the figure itself. Only non-colour figures are published in the journal.

Tables without cell shading can be created in EXCEL or WORD. Table titles are placed above the table body and table notes below the table.

If the paper is written in Slovak or Czech, then figure captions and tables, including title and footnotes are required to be both in English and Slovak.

Figures and tables (including captions, titles, bodies and notes) are required to be placed at the end of the article with each figure or table on a separate page.

Ensure all figure and table citations in the text match the files provided.

Reference formatting

Citation in the text includes the author's surname and publication year, see the examples of varying numbers of authors bellow:

	Citation in text
1 author	Woodward (1992) (Woodward 1992)
2 authors	Martin and Saller (1957) (Martin and Saller 1957)
3 and more authors	Ferembach et al. (1980) (Ferembach et al. 1980)

Quoting a specific text is required to be present in quotation marks and at least one quoted page should be specified. Example: "The distribution of the Athenian and Balkan male samples is also different but not as pronouncedly." (Nikitta et al. 2018, p.4)

Please ensure that every reference cited in the text is also present in the reference list (and vice versa).

The reference list is unnumbered and ordered alphabetically according to the surname of the first author/s. References for the same author are listed by publication years in chronological order. Surnames and names abbreviations of each author is required in all listed references. Journal titles are abbreviated according to the recommendations of the ISO 4 standard, in the case of less popular journals, abbreviations are not required. In case of identical journals titles with publishing in different countries, city/country of publication is required in parentheses, e.g. *Biology (Bratislava)*.

Downloaded figure

Downloaded figure should be cited with the author consent.

Downloaded figure with known author is cited as followed: author's name, authors' names of publication, publication year, publication page with cited figure, figure number in origin publication. This specific publication is required to be present in both text and reference list.

Example: Fig.1: Dentinogenesis imperfecta (Foto I. Jonas; Rakosi, Jonas a Graber 1993, p. 67, obr. 160)

Downloaded figure without present author is cited as a publication in reference list.

Example: Fig.2: A ground section of deciduous tooth (Meyer 1932)

Example: Fig.3: Lokalizovaná hypoplázia mliečneho očného zuba (Skinner a Hung 1989)
